PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

BILLY BRUMFIELD SHELTER FOR MEN

The Billy Brumfield Shelter provides emergency shelter for men seeking a safe, warm place to sleep. The program also offers a drug-work transitional program and a special needs program.

CHAPEL

While we provide lots of help with physical needs, Stewpot is also a place where a person's spirit can be filled and fed. In our chapel service, we sing, think, pray, and worship God together. Day in and day out, we focus on God's love for us all.

CLOTHING CLOSET

The Clothing Closet provides quality clothing for all who come to Stewpot. The Clothing Closet is stocked with clothing donated from residents of the Jackson Metro area.



COMMUNITY KITCHEN

The Community Kitchen provides a noontime meal to anyone- no questions asked- seven days a week, 365 days a year.



FOOD PANTRY

The Stewpot Food Pantry serves over 700 people a month. Each family is given a four-day supply of groceries to cover the entire household.



HEARTWORKS

HeARTworks is an art ministry that meets each Tuesday morning and offers artistic opportunities to friends in our Stewpot community. Volunteers give their time to teach a new technique, lead a craft project, or simply encourage our artists before they enjoy lunch in the Stewpot Community Kitchen at noon.



HOUSING ASSISTANCE

The Housing Assistance program helps people move from homelessness into stable housing by providing short-term rental subsidies. Case managers find supportive resources, including job training and mental health resources, to help participants stay housed permanently.

LEGAL CLINIC

Stewpot offers a free legal clinic every Tuesday at noon in the Community Kitchen. Attorneys can advise or refer on family law, vital records, housing, expungements, disability, and financial matters.

MATT'S HOUSE

Matt's House Emergency Shelter provides shelter for homeless women and children. Residents receive an evening meal, light breakfast, and a safe place to sleep.

MEALS ON WHEELS

Each weekday, staff and volunteers make and deliver plate lunches to 70 elderly, ill, and disabled people who cannot make it to lunch at Stewpot.

OPPORTUNITY CENTER DAY SHELTER

The Opportunity Center Day Shelter offers community resources such as laundry, mail services, and computer access. The Opportunity Center also operates as an emergency shelter during the cold, winter months.



ST. DOMINIC COMMUNITY HEALTH CLINIC

In partnership with Stewpot, St. Dominic Health Services operates a Community Health Clinic providing primary care to low-income families and homeless individuals whose needs are not being met by mainstream healthcare.

STREET OUTREACH

Stewpot Outreach Workers go out into the community and form relationships with people experiencing homelessness, connecting them to resources and services available to them.



PROGRAMS FOR KIDS & TEENS

Stewpot operates an after-school program for children and teens during the school year in addition to a summer camp each year.
